

Participants will explore movement, play and art-making within the relational field of body and landscape - body and matter - body and object. Responding to individual needs Gemma will work with participants within nature, whatever the weather, as well as in the studio space. There will be time for outdoor movement practice, awakening the body to our different facets of perception and to move/dance/be still with nature. There will be time to create and art-make from our experiences and time to share verbally what wants to be shared through the process.

Gemma Higginbotham (MA, RSME/T) is a dance artist and somatic movement practitioner. She has been working with the poetics of the body for over twenty eight years. She performs internationally, facilitates in professional, community and health care settings, creates and has her own somatic movement practice in Cumbria where she offers one-to-one client sessions.
