Class/Workshops - Moving mysteries – general information

Gemma Higginbotham (MA, RSME/T) Dance Artist and registered somatic movement educator and therapist (RSME/T)

Gemma's classes and workshops are informed by her current improvisatory practice, Moving Mysteries: A Midwifery of Embodied Metaphor.

Gemma uses guided embodied explorations and movement scores to bring awareness to our relational interactions, opening to curiosities, to surprise- to what moves us or is moving through us. The body is held as revered source of knowledge, learning and creativity. She facilitates a deepening of embodied awareness, a sensitising of our many facets of perception and invites a detailed articulation of body within the flow of presence.

Focus is on a refining of the subtleties of improvised relational practice, playful engagement, durational awareness and attendance to the oscillating energies which support the emergence of image through embodiment.

Periods of reflection (writing, drawing and/or verbal exchange) may be embedded within the class/workshop to support the integration of the experience and articulation of practice.
